Below is the information for a horse running in a race with important information indicated. Using this information, answer the following questions.

Based on the above information, what is the name of the horse and who was it trained by?

Point 1 is showing us the weight the horse is carrying. This includes the jockey and the saddle. Why do you think this is important?

Look at the information at point 2. The information indicated here is telling us the age, colour and sex of the horse. What age is this horse? Why do you think this may be important information?

Stay at point 2 as in the previous question. The 'B' represents the colour and 'G' represents the sex. There are many colour types and sex categories for horses, each one has a code. In this case the 'G' stands for gelding. Can you research what colour this horse is based on the information given?

5

The 'Form' tells us where the horse finishing in its previous races. A line at the end indicates the end of a year (-), while 'P' means the horse pulled up or was stopped by the jockey. The numbers indicate the position that the horse finished in. You read the 'Form' from right to left, so in this case the horse pulled up in its most recent race. In which of its previous races did the horse come first?
